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Dear Treasured Parent.

Happy New Year! Welcome to another splendid year: 2020 is a glorious year full of endless possibilities of great and amazing things to be experienced. Welcome on board as we achieve greatness together! First term was fantastic! We appreciate God for His help so far; and we are glad about your continued support.

A PEEP INTO THE NEW TERM:

VALUES: This term, we will be learning about the importance of Taking Instructions. We will be teaching the children the value of obeying instructions properly and on time; as well as practically showing them how instruction can save them a lot of troubles in life. And during our love day event, we will explore the importance of forgiveness and sharing, even as we reinforce these values on our annual trip to an orphanage and chold our love day event.

PREFECT ELECTIONS: Thriving Treasures would hold its first annual elections for school prefects this term. Year 4 & 5 students are eligible to contest for the various positions available, and will be sworn in by the mid-term break, based on the decision on the student populace via the election process. The process is designed to mirror the Nigerian constitutional process, giving the children the opportunity to learn first-hand, and practice the concept of exercising their civic duties to use free and fair elections to communicate their wishes in the democratic society that they will be growing up into. The elections and campaign

schedules will be made available shortly, so that parents can support their children as needed.

OPEN DAY: Our open day comes up between the 2nd and 6th of March, 2020. This is an opportunity to meet up with your child's teachers and the school one-on-one to follow up on your child's progress. It also affords you the opportunity to work out a plan to collaborate with your child's teachers and the school on an individual learning plan that is unique to your child's needs.

WORLD BOOK DAY: We will be celebrating World Book Day (5th of March) with activities to strengthen our pupils' literacy and communication skills. It will be an in-house activity geared towards stimulating our children's interest for books, spelling and generally improving their literacy skills.

ASSESMENT FORMART FOR PRIMARY: We hold three tests per term (every three weeks), to help our primary pupils process and maximize learning their course content, and improve on their performance. This is to help the children revise in smaller chunks and assimilate more thereby improving their performance. Please note that Holiday home fun, projects and assignments count towards the overall assessment of your child. Teachers will be looking for originality, proof that the child carried out the task (not the parent), and the child's ability to reproduce and apply the concepts learned through the task.

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CODING & ICT: Coding classes continue this term. They are learning basic programming skills, pushing them towards computer literacy and dexterity. We appreciate the parents who have provided laptops for their children to participate in class, carry out projects and assignments, and practice on their own. We encourage parents that are yet to provide to do so as soon as possible.

FRUITS: We would like to especially commend parents who have been providing fruits for their children's fruit break. We would also like to encourage other parents to work towards replacing their children's snacks and fizzy drinks with fresh fruits, for a healthier lifestyle.

MEDICATION: Medications to be administered in school should be written in the communication book and signed by parents. Information should include name of drugs, dosage and time to be administered. Only medication that is accompanied by this information will be administered.

& Thursdays for children in uniform classes (Preschool - Yr 5). Uniforms should be neat and worn with white socks and black shoes at all times. Wednesdays are for sporting activities, pupils are to come in sport wear, white socks and white canvass, while Fridays remain mufti-days. On colour days, early years pupils (Play group - Nur 2) are to put on outfits that have the colour to be taught on that day. Please keep the children's hair looking tidy at all times. Beads are not allowed. Boy's hair should be well cut. Nails are to be trimmed weekly for hygiene and safety purposes.

CLUBS: Club activities continue to hold on Wednesdays and Fridays. Please endeavor to register your child for at least 1 club through the appropriate communication channel.

COMMUNICATION BOOK: The communication book is a correspondence between home and school. Please take time out regularly to check it so you can catch up with what is happening and how your child is faring in school. Communication book cost N2000 each for replacement

PUNCTUALITY: School opens at 7:00am and assembly starts by 7:45am. Pupils are prepared for the day, and we explore the **Values for the term** on the assembly. Please ensure that your children are always on time and do not miss assembly.

CLOSING TIME & PICK-UP: School closes by 2:30pm for Pre-School to Year 3. Year 4 and 5 pupils close by 4pm due to compulsory After-School Lessons. Pupils that are picked later than 4pm should notify the school and pay for After school Care, which then extends their stay till 6pm. Late pick up (after 4pm) attracts a fine of N 2 000 per hour per child. Late pick up after 6pm for pupils subscribing for after school also attracts the same fine.

<u>FEES</u>: Prompt payment of fees will enable us to serve you better. Parents are encouraged to adhere strictly to the terms stated in the new **School fees Policy** and route all account enquiries and correspondence through the designated person.
